



Community Engagement Award (CEA)

Introduction:

Asian Pacific Islander - Coalition for Health Against Tobacco (API-CHAT) is releasing \$2,000 to 4-6 local organizations serving Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander (AANHPI) populations (Asian, Middle Eastern, Pacific Islander, South Asian, Southeast Asian) in Hercules or Danville.

Issue:

Contra Costa has the highest smoking rates and the highest disparities in smoking rates for AANHPI. Smoking rates for Contra Costa County AANHPI are twice those of Whites, almost twice those of Hispanic/Latinx, and 25% higher than African Americans. According to the California Healthy Kids Survey, disparities also exist for AANHPI youth tobacco use in Contra Costa County: Pacific Islander and Latinx seventh graders had the highest vaping rates of all races/ethnicities.

What other cities have done:

Reduce youth's access to tobacco and hold retailers accountable. Some examples include prohibiting new tobacco retailers near schools and restricting licenses for retailers who are found to illegally sell tobacco to youth.

About Us:

API-CHAT will work with high school students, college students, parents and community leaders to restore our community's health by developing policies to combat the tobacco industry from infiltrating our communities and poisoning the next generation. We support activities that focus on policy, system, and environmental change through community assessments, data collection, media events, and the education of community members, as well as decision makers.
